## Business Meeting Minutes

The NAML business meeting began at 3:50 p.m., Billie Swalla, Treasurer on phone.
Treasurer Report. Treasurer Swalla's position on agenda was moved to beginning. Brett Burk (BAI) put spreadsheet up on screen. The budget spreadsheet is appended. Swalla reviewed the material, initiating a short discussion of dues at the beginning. There was discussion of a change in dues structure that resulted in a consensus from those attending that no change should occur.

Membership. Membership was reviewed by Jill Drupa (BAI). Member invoices were sent out twice. Ten small labs, 10 medium labs and 12 large labs have paid in 2018. Drupa encouraged members attending to make sure that their institutions had paid dues. NAML currently has a list of 170 marine labs; most have not paid. NAML members indicated that we need to bring others into the fold. Getting a dozen more would make a difference in health of the organization. Some suggested that they would contact some of the labs while others indicated that NAML needs to make sure that the benefits of membership are clear. This will demonstrate the value of membership.

Education Committee. Emily Burbacher made the report for the Education Committee. She gave an overview concerning the committee's initiatives on diversity, undergraduate research opportunities, NSF undergraduate awards, and other projects.

Data Integration/Network Integration. Steve Weisberg reported on efforts of data integration/network integration project. Weisberg gave update on potential collaborative projects. WAML is going to be NAML test case. Weisberg discussed putting a proposal together with NOAA as a lead group. Currently this has been put on hiatus. Now genomic barcoding library is at the forefront. The project members are looking at barcode data along west coast. The initial idea is to pick three taxonomic groups and ask people up and down coast to see if within species variation is less than within genera variation. Smithsonian is interested in doing the sequencing. The working group is planning to expand if this is successful. Bill Moser from Smithsonian discussed the interest that they have in the project. Mike O’Mahoney also attending the NAML meeting, described the plan for data related to sequencing bank being developed by the Smithsonian. Teaching groups are interested in getting some exchanges going to incorporate material into classes.

Science Communications. Karina Nielsen, chair of the science communications working group, gave some information on what the group is proposing to do. She noted that the group would like to take a small step by telling the story of marine labs on social media. She also suggested developing an editorial about the value of marine labs in education at all levels, including outreach. This could be used as a template by different labs to offer such an editorial in their local area.

Regional Organization Breakout Meetings. There was a break in the group meetings for the regional groups to confer. Report outs were made from regional members.

- SAML April 8-10 at Eckerd College. Hurricane Resiliency will be a topic.
- NEAMGLL reported discussing development of student-based awards for meetings and research grants. July $24-26$ will be summer meetings. Changing water levels and increased flooding will be topics highlighted at the meetings. Members plan on contacting inactive members and update them on what is going on in NAML to bring them back to the organization.

Members at the meeting thanked Mike DeLuca for the excellent meeting in New Jersey during Fall 2017.
The business meeting was adjourned for reception at Washington Plaza Foyer beginning at 5:30.
