ECONOMIC IMPACT: FISHERIES & TOURISM THE NEP HELPING COMBAT HARMFUL ALGAL BLOOMS

The fishing industry loses as much as \$34M a year in sales when seafood is contaminated with toxins from harmful algal blooms (HABs) (CDC 2019). Researchers estimate \$22M is lost annually (medical costs & lost work days) during HAB events (FL Dept. of Health, 2019). The NEP works to reduce nutrient pollution entering our waters from all sources, conserves coastal habitats that remove pollution, and encourages sustainable stormwater management to control the pollution that can lead to HABs.

COMMUNITY IMPACT: RESILIENCE THE NEP BUILDS RESILIENT COMMUNITIES & ECOSYSTEMS

The NEP focuses on building innovative solutions that better help ecosystems and the communities that surround them to be resilient to storms and increased pollution. Oyster restoration helps to keep waters clean and provides a food source for local communities. Salt marsh restoration is a built-in natural protective barrier for storms and provides essential habitat for all commercial fish species.
