- ●489,000 P-12 students participated in NOAA-supported formal education programs


2019 NOAA-wide Education Accomplishments

New Opportunity Conservation Corps Act Direct Hire Authority

- Conservation Service Corps Act of 2019 allows NOAA to direct hire interns up to two years after earning undergraduate or graduate degrees

Educational Partnership Program w/Minority Serving Institutions

- Supports 4 cooperative science centers and undergraduate scholarships
- ■19% of students from NAML institutions (66 out of 351)

Ernest F. Hollings Undergraduate Scholarship

- Two year undergraduate scholarship for rising juniors in NOAA mission fields
- 48% of students from NAML institutions (185 out of 385 students, 2017 2019)
- Top Source Schools: U. Miami (25), Eckerd (23), U. South Carolina (14), U. Maryland (13); U. North Carolina, Wilmington (9), Western Washington University (8)







Bay Watershed Education and Training

- B-WET provides grants to increase understanding and stewardship of local watersheds through multi-stage activities performed both outdoors and in the classroom
- Since 2002, 60 awards to 23 unique NAML institutions totaling \$8M
- Grant recipients include:
 - Gulf Coast Research Laboratory
 - Chesapeake Biological Laboratory



Environmental Literacy Program

- Provides grants and in-kind support to improve ecosystem stewardship and increase resilience to environmental hazards through education
- Awarded over \$75 million since 2005
- 2019:
 - OProvided support for 157 institutions serving 50 million visitors
 - Northeastern University Marine Science Center current partner on two resilience grants





Citizen Science Community of Practice

- NOAA supports a broad range of citizen science projects
- 49 NOAA projects listed in federal catalog
- NOAA citizen science has generated more than half a million volunteer hours
- Citizen science established as a NOAA Strategic Priority
- April 22-24 NOAA citizen science workshop now virtual



New Opportunity NSF Graduate Research Internship Program

- NSF-NOAA agreement allows NSF Graduate
 Research Fellows to conduct internships at NOAA
 - 6,500 active Graduate Research Fellows, including @1,000 in NOAA mission fields
 - Awards to 1st and 2nd year PhD students
 - Fellows have 3 years of support at \$34000/year and \$5k for travel or research costs for internships
 - Internships can be 8 weeks to 12 months in duration
 - NOAA has hosted 16 GRIP recipients NMFS (15) NWS (1)
